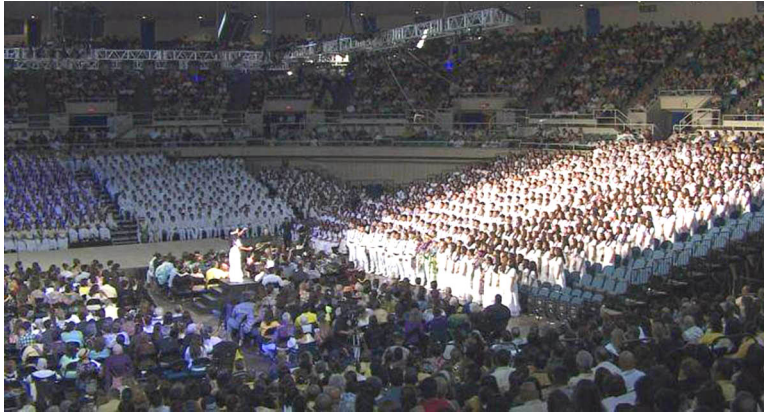

Abstract:

The Song Contest is unique to Kamehameha—a tradition that has involved all students in musical competition for ninety-four years. Miss Laura Brown, Director of Music at Kamehameha 1926–1947, stated that ‘the objectives of the song contest are to build up the repertoire of the best in Hawaiian music for the cultural heritage of any student who attends Kamehameha; to develop leadership, cooperation and good class spirit; and to give students the use of their singing voices and to give them pleasure in singing as a means of expression.’ From the 2015 Song Contest website at <http://www.ksbe.edu/songcontest/2015/>

Historical note

Singing has always been a means of expression among the students of Kamehameha, so it was natural that such affairs as the annual song contest would evolve.

On Wednesday evening, preceding Armistice Day in 1920, the boys staged an inter-class song and stunt night, the first of its kind. The classes competed for the George Alanson Andrus trophy presented by the athletic association in honor of Mr. Andrus, who for several years was director of music at the

school for boys.

The second annual song contest was held in the spring at the school for girls and the third about the same time at the school for boys.

A second trophy was donated to be given to the winner of the junior division, which was created in the annual song contest at the school for girls. This cup was donated by Mrs. Theodore Richards. The original cup, which had been donated by Mrs. L.H. Scoville of Watertown, Conn., was made the award for the senior division winner in the contest. This latter cup is known as the New England Mother's cup.

This donation came about when Mrs. Scoville, visiting the Hawaiian Islands, heard the girls of Kamehameha sing and was so impressed with the charm of the Hawaiian melodies that she made arrangements for the cup to be awarded to the annual song contest winner. This same years a junior division was arranged for the school for boys song contest and a cup donated by Richard H. Trent, a member of the board of trustees. The original school for boys contest cup, the George A. Andrus cup, was designated as the trophy for the senior division winner. In an opening speech at the school for boys 928 song contest, James Hakuole, '28, traced the origin of the Andrus cup as follows: "Back in the fall of 1912 Mr. George A. Andrus, Oberlin college, an institution that is also known for its good singing, came to Kamehameha to teach music. He died in 1920. Mr. Andrus is the man who inspired our present system of annual song contests held here. During the school year 1920-21, R. J. Borden suggested a memorial cup and the Kamehameha Athletic association donated it."

Interest in Honolulu led to interscholastic song contest, Kamehameha winning the int erscholastic song contest in 1928.

*Each class sings two Hawaiian songs, a choice song which the class selects and the prize song selected by the music department of the school. A song leader is chosen by the class to lead it in the contest. **Ka Mo'i** , Tuesday, February 11, 1947, Vol. 23, No. 4 Honolulu, Hawaii U.S.A.*

1921 [GEORGE ALANSON ANDRUS TROPHY](#) Senior Division Award, Kamehameha School for Boys

On May 26, 1921 the Kamehameha School for Boys staged an inter-class song and stunt night, the first of its kind. The classes competed for the GEORGE ALANSON ANDRUS TROPHY. This was a memorial trophy presented by the Athletic Association in honor of Mr. Andrus, who for several years was director of music at the School for

1922 [NEW ENGLAND MOTHERS CUP](#) Senior Division, Kamehameha School for Girls

The NEW ENGLAND MOTHERS CUP came about when Mrs. E.G. Scoville of Watertown, Connecticut, visiting the Hawaiian Islands in 1922, heard the girls of Kamehameha sing and was so impressed with the charm of the Hawaiian melodies that she made arrangements for the cup to be awarded to the annual song contest winner. *Ka Moi*: February 11, 1947, March 19, 1986

1922 MARY ATHERTON RICHARDS LOVING CUP, the Junior Division Award, Kamehameha School for Girls

In 1922, Mrs. Theodore Richards, wife of a former Kamehameha Schools Principal, donated the MARY ATHERTON RICHARDS LOVING CUP for the winner of the junior division (gr. 7,8,9) at the Girls' School. A philanthropist, she funded the Ida M. Pope Fund which continues to finance Hawaiian girls who wish to continue their education so that they can help better living standards here in the islands. The junior division competition ended in SY. 1954-55 when the seventh and eighth grades became a part of the Kamehameha Schools Preparatory Department. *SB/Adv.* February 1, 1947 *Ka Moi*: February 11, 1947, May 11, 1951

1928 RICHARD H. TRENT, the Junior Division Award

During SY 1927-28 a junior division was created for the School for Boys annual song contest. A cup was donated by RICHARD H. TRENT , Trustee of the Kamehameha Schools from 1917 to 1939. He was also a Trustee of Bernice P. Bishop Museum.

The original school for boys contest cup, the George A. Andrus cup, was designated as the trophy for the senior division winner and the Richard H. Trent Cup for the junior division winner. *Ka Moi*: April 21, 1934, February 11, 1947



1967 CHARLES E. KING CUP for the Combined winning class

In 1967 a new dimension was added to the song contest when the boys and girls of each class (gr. 9, 10, 11, 12) combined to present a song. The KS/BE Trustees offered an additional trophy, the CHARLES E. KING Cup, to be given to the combined winning class.

Charles Edward King was born on the Queen Emma Estate in Nu'uuanu Valley. Queen Emma christened him at St. Andrews Cathedral on September 20, 1874. He was baptized Charles Edward King in honor of Prince Charles Edward of Great Britain.

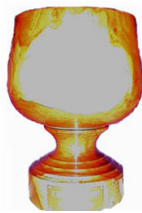
He studied at the Kamehameha Schools and graduated in 1891, a

member of the Schools first graduating class in 1891. Mr. Charles Reed Bishop took an interest in him and saw to his receiving a scholarship to Oswego Normal School in New York. Returning to Hawaii, King taught music in the public schools and also at Kamehameha, conducted the Royal Hawaiian Band, and for a time served as a Territorial Senator.

He is best remembered as a prolific writer of Hawaiian songs. Among the most famous of these are Ke Kali Nei Au, Imi Au Ia 'Oe, Ku'u Lei Lehua, and Ka'iulani Ali'i. Song Contest Program: March 17, 1972

1972 LOUISE AOE MCGREGOR AWARD, the Student Director Award

The LOUISE AOE MCGREGOR AWARD, named for a member of the first graduating class of the School for Girls in 1897, was first presented in 1972. This award is given to the student director who is recognized as having made significant contributions to the entire class and has shown organizational ability, leadership, assistance to others, and persistence. 1989 RICHARD LYMAN, JR . "OLELO MAKUAHINE," the Hawaiian Language Award

Mr. Richard Lyman, Jr. a Kamehameha Schools Bishop Estate Trustee from 1959 to 1988, was keenly interested in the preservation of the Hawaiian language and culture. Since 1989 the RICHARD LYMAN, JR . "OLELO MAKUAHINE" (mother tongue) Award is presented to the class whose use of the Hawaiian language within a song is excellent. Song Contest Program: 1989



1993 HELEN DESHA BEAMER AWARD, the Class Award

The HELEN DESHA BEAMER AWARD made its debut at the 1993 Song Contest and recognizes the best musical performance by a class. Donated by the Kamehameha Alumni Association, the award honors the substantial contributions of Helen Desha Beamer to the lexicon of Hawaiian music. Helen Desha Beamer was a 1900 graduate of the Kamehameha School for Girls. Song Contest Program: March 19, 1993
